INTRODUCTION

GigaTime Hope Foundation was established in 2009 with the vision of protecting our women and youths from vices that leads to destruction of Homes, in line with the vision and operations of the organisation over the past years, the name was changed to Family Care and Development Foundation (FCDF) to reflect our objectives of advancing the home units by supporting programs that will strengthen and establish our homes on a steady foundation for better society.

In the past years our Royal Diadem Project provided access to vocational skills acquisition training for youths and women between the ages of 21 to 35 within Ibadan metropolis of Oyo state, Nigeria. We have also provided support to orphanages and a youth correctional facility.

This year, our operation was targeted mainly at empowering the physically challenged persons. In addition, we also sustained our relationship with the Oyo state remand home.

SAMSON AMOSUN:

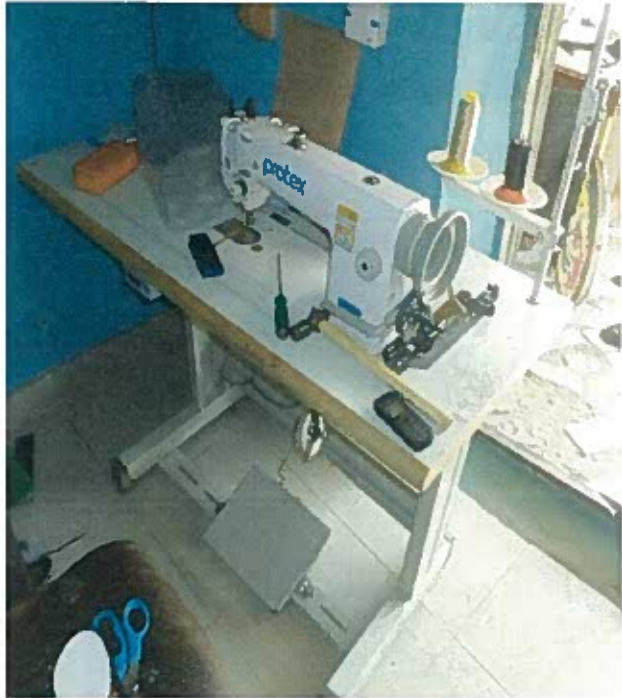

The juvenile correction remand home and child care unit is also a centre for abandoned children and has a total resident of 113 children and young adults.

Family care and development foundation last year took up the renovation of the hostel (boy and girl) and also sponsored one of the residents, Bolaji Joseph, who gained admission to Oyo State College of Education (Special) Oyo.

The Matron of the facility made a special request for a Rally Grass cutter and a Wheelbarrow to help in the maintenance of the surrounding. The matron has immense passion to uplift the life of the children and provide them with more conducive environment for the children to play around.

We also maintained our support for Bolaji Joseph's education at Oyo state college of education by paying for the accommodation and some allowance to take care of some basic needed. We hope to be more invoiced in the coming year.

Other items purchased for the home include:

- i) DuraVolts stabilizer was also obtained to protect the electronic equipments in the home
- ii) Purchase of some food items.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT AND LEADERSHIP TRAINING PROGRAM

Youth leadership skills are valuable to the entire community and their voice and perspective on issues are irreplaceable. The need to create an enabling environment and platform for the youths to develop their potentials is very critical. This will enable them to take their rightful position in the community and contribute more positive to the running of their immediate environment.

These necessitate the development of our youth training modules in conjunction with youthboost and volunteer youth leaders from the two major higher institutions in Ibadan.

The main operational goal of this program is to build a database of 50, 000 literate youths within the age group of 13 years to 29 years by the end of December 2015 and design a sustainable communication and strategy feedback mechanism with these youths.

Operational methodology

1. To organise seminars and workshops to enlighten and develop the leadership potentials in our youths.
2. To use Short Message Service and electronic mails to communicate and training youths on leadership skills
3. To distribute hard copies bulletins to support the electronic training material.
4. To exposes youth to role models and leaders
5. Assists young people to become self-sufficient and productive members of society
