## **Summary of Activities 2015**

#### <u>Geneva</u>

On 21 November 2015, Harambee4Africa organized a charity walk through the Versoix walking trail. The proceeds were donated to Feet of Grace Foundation to contribute towards the purchase of prosthetic limbs for amputees in Nigeria.

#### Ghana

Purchases and fixed new Mosquito Nets at the School for the Deaf and Dumb, Sekondi, Ghana

#### **Kenya**

Foundation for Arid and Semi -Arid Lands projects: sponsoring needy students, improving the structure for the Rescue Centre, providing homes with solar lanterns, supporting educational requirements for the less privileged children, etc.

#### <u>Nigeria</u>

GigaTime Hope Foundation projects: educational support, providing basic computer training for children in Cheshire Home, youth development and leadership training, physiotherapy sessions for children in the remand home, etc.
